1. Sergeant Jevin Womack

Sergeant Womack has 24 years of experience and began his service to Heath as a volunteer/reserve officer. He was hired full time in 2001. A well-known face in the community, Sergeant Womack is also an ace when it comes to the public safety side of special events like the Heart of Heath 5k.
