







CITY OF HEATH SUPPORTS LOCAL CHILD ADVOCACY CENTER

Mayor Kelson Elam proclaimed April 2022 as National Child Abuse Prevention Month in Heath during the April 26 meeting to support the Children's Advocacy Center for Rockwall County's efforts to bring awareness to the crisis. In Rockwall County, child abuse cases reported are up 79% from 2021.

"Effective child abuse prevention activities succeed because of the meaningful connections and partnerships created between child welfare, education, health, community and faith-based organizations, businesses and law enforcement agencies," said Mayor Elam. "Communities must make efforts to work together to promote awareness and activities that benefit children and their families in a safe, stable, nurturing environment."

The Children's Advocacy Center for Rockwall County provides a multiagency coordinated approach to the investigation, prosecution and treatment of child abuse victims and provides a safe, child-friendly environment to seek justice and promote healing for Rockwall County's most vulnerable citizens more effectively. COMMUNITY KICKS OFF EASTER WITH THE RETURN OF THE HEART OF **HEATH 5K AND 1-MILE FAMILY RUN**

Spirits were high and rain showers held off as the Heath community gathered for the return of the Heart of Heath 5k and One-Mile Family Run on April 16.

There were 314 runners and walkers, including Johnny Biffar of Plano, who took 1st Place in the 5k with a 17:25 time. The 1st Place Male Master was Christian Jack of Canton, with a 19:53 time. The Overall Female 5k winner was Anna McDuffie of West Monroe, LA, at 20.57, and the 1st Place Female Master was Donna Fuentes of Heath at 25:15.

The youngest winners of the day were the Top 3 Boys and Top 3 Girls in the 1-Mile Family Run. Taking 1st Place among the girls was Aria Lee; 2nd Place was Kinsley Fain; and 3rd Place was Julia Hunter. The 1st Place boy was Thomas Hendrickson; 2nd Place was Luke Scott; and 3rd Place was Taiten Marzluff.

The Heath DPS includes two civilian employees and 29 officers who are triple certified as fire fighters, police officers and EMTs.
