We are moving full speed into 2025 with excitement about the opportunities and success the months ahead will bring: a renovated Towne Center Park; construction of new Department of Public Safety and Public Works facilities; and implementation of the Water Bridge plan with construction of the first wells, to name a few.

At the groundbreaking for the Towne Center Park project in December, I was once again deeply touched by what a wonderful community of servant leaders and volunteers we have. Citizens who are willing to share their own time and resources to make Heath a place we are all proud to call home.

Obviously, I can never thank our volunteer City council and board and commission members often enough for all that they do. There are many others in the community to also acknowledge.

Like Bob and Kathy Tolbert. Upon moving to Heath from Santa Fe in 2023, they reached out to learn more about their new hometown and how they could give back.

As a result, I'm pleased to share that this incredibly generous couple recently made a significant donation to the Parks And Trails of Heath (PATH) program. Their gift enables us to build the new Pickleball Pavillion at Towne Center Park with eight full pickleball courts – six of which will be shaded.

It's no secret that with every day that passes, construction costs rise. The vision the Park Board had for pickleball in Heath was in jeopardy due to a changing budget before the Tolbert's contribution to retain the original design.

If you know Bob and Kathy, give them a hug or a high five. If you don't, we will be recognizing them at the January 14 City Council meeting. Come join us and meet them!

We also received another generous PATH donation to support a City Hall beatification and refresh plan that includes interior painting, refurbishing the exterior monument sign, hardscaping the entrance/exit corners and extending sidewalk connections to tie into City trails. This donor wishes to remain anonymous, but they can be assured we are grateful.

CITY OF HEATH PROJECT PROGRESS REPORT



EXPANDING THE WATER SYSTEM

- A Water Bridge Plan is now undergoing a feasibility study.
- The plan includes six potable water wells to be built in 2025 and 2026, plus a 1.5-million-gallon elevated storage tank to be built by 2026.
- This should bring total water storage to 6.5 million gallons, up from the current five million, and increase the daily water available to 10 12 million gallons per day. That is up from the current maximum of 6 million gallons per day. The final numbers will depend upon well production.



ENHANCING PUBLIC SAFETY

- The Heath Nixle Everbridge system to provide Heath-specific alerts controlled locally is now live.
- Construction of the new Department of Public Safety station is progressing on City-owned land at Hawk Drive and Chris Cuny Boulevard (The Reserve).
- The new DPS station will include the first of a series of outdoor warning sirens to be constructed in Heath.
- The new DPS station will also house the new ladder fire truck to be delivered this fall.

- The new City of Heath TextMyGov system enables you to use your mobile phone's text messaging service to quickly access information.
- Text the word "Hi" to the 972-961-1997 or send a message containing keywords relevant to your search such as: bulky brush; watering schedule; trash schedule; permits; code violation; weeds; streetlight outage or events.

PUBLIC RECORDS



- This new web portal enables you to make open record requests online.
- You may find what you're looking for without having to submit a new request. Just click the search button.
- Official records are held by City departments and the Clerk pursuant to governing document retention schedules.



IMPROVING INFRASTRUCTURE

NEW PUBLIC WORKS FACILITY

- Construction is underway on the current City-owned site at 1284 FM 740.
- Weather permitting, the facility should be completed by October 2025 to provide space to safely accommodate staff and store equipment and vehicles.

FIRE FLOW

- Council awarded a construction contract for new water lines and fire hydrants for Darr Estates and Meadowlake Lane at its December 10, 2024, meeting.
- This is part of the Fire Flow Capital Improvement Plan to solve deficient water lines and fire hydrants in numerous areas of the City.
- The plan was accelerated in the Summer of 2024 from a 10-year timeline to a 5-year timeline without a tax impact to citizens.



ENRICHING QUALITY OF LIFE

TOWNE CENTER PARK RENOVATION

- The City held a groundbreaking ceremony for the Towne Center Park renovation project on December 19.
- The event was a celebration of community and the many leaders and volunteers, past and present, who have worked hard to bring the vision for this gem in the Heart of Heath to life: Mayors and Councilmembers; Park Board members; Heath Economic Development/ Municipal Development (HEDC/HMBC) board members; Parks And Trails of Heath (PATH) supporters; City managers and staff; and the teams at Kimley-Horn and Hill & Wilkinson General Contractors.
- Amenities will include the City's first potable water well to irrigate the park and provide additional water supply.
- Weather permitting, the renovation will be completed by December 2025.



- The City of Heath is committed to preserving a special way of life where rolling hills and the sparkling lake provide a serene backdrop for beautiful neighborhoods, distinctive homes and premier outdoor recreation opportunities.

THANK YOU FOR CONSERVING WATER!

Citywide water usage has frequently been less than 1 million gallons per day between November 1 and January 08. The lowest usage was 733,000 gallons. The average daily use during this period was 1.508 million gallons per day.

The City of Heath's water supplier -- North Texas Municipal Water District (NTMWD) via the City of Rockwall -- mandates a year-round, two-day-a-week irrigation schedule for all end-users. The City of Heath adopted this model as requested by the NTMWD.

DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS BRYAN CREED NAMED CITYWIDE EMPLOYEE OF THE YEAR
